Activity Highlights

1. Steering Committee Nominee Slate

- All 5 existing members accepted reappointment.
- Formal invite letters went out to 9 new nominees.
- 7 of 9 new members have formally accepted so far.

2. Science Advisory Committee Update

• 5 nominees before you later today.

3. Grants Committee Update

• Two new members with expertise in habitat were added to this subcommittee: Caitlin Chaffee, NBNERR and John O'Brien, TNC.

4. Vision 2032 Progress

- Fast-track ICR materials sent from EPA HQ to OMB—a decision is expected very soon.
- Draft Action Planning Worksheet complete that will be used in Focal Area Working Groups in March.

5. Blackstone Watershed Needs Assessment

- 33 local stakeholders joined Meeting #5 on 11/19.
- Draft Needs Assessment complete and in internal review.

6. New Coastal Visitation Story Map

• Published new Science Update as a Story Map titled, "How Do We Use Our Coasts?" that uses mobile phone technology to provide insights into patterns of use along the shores of the region.

7. Working Groups Update

- Social Science: Met on 2/1, contracted facilitator support, new meeting framework and plans for Meeting #2 under development
- Salt Marsh: Met 11/18 and 1/14, partner work debrief and discussed revision of Restoration, Assessment, and Monitoring Program framework.

8. Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion

- Contracting to begin to hire Impact by Design (IbD) to complete an Organizational JEDI Assessment of NBEP to begin in March 2021.
- IBD seeks group of 5-6 staff/committee member volunteers to join planning group to guide kick-off of process—Mike will be in touch.

9. Blackstone Fish Passage Project

• Participated in 2 meeting with RIDEM staff to lead creation of new team to pursue fish passage on the lower four Blackstone dams.

10. Subaward and Contract Management

• Continued to provide day-to-day management of 16 ongoing projects.

Science Advisory Committee Nomination Procedure

- In 2019 the SAC created an expertise matrix to assess current knowledge gaps
- SAC provided suggestions for new members to fill gaps and matrix used to assess fit
- NBEP Staff Scientist researched expertise and interviewed potential nominees
- New slate presented via email to SAC in January 2021 for discussion
- SAC advancing consensus slate of 5 nominees (2 replacements, 3 new members) for 3-year terms.
- Asking EC to send full slate to SC for approval at April 1st meeting

NERR System


- National network of 29 NERRs nationwide (soon to be 30)


